One of the cougar subspecies, the Florida panther is tawny brown on the back and pale gray underneath, with white flecks on the head, neck and shoulder.

Panthers mainly eat white-tailed deer, but they will sometimes wild hog, rabbit, raccoon, armadillo and birds.

The panther's behavior is territorial and often travel at night. They don't travel in groups; rather, individually.

Their biggest threat is human development of land and population growth. They are also often threatened by vehicles. We are the main reasoning behind their endangered status. They are also threatened by parasites, and other diseases.
